 be admitted as a member of said Home.

To enable the authorities to determine whether or not he is legally entitled to become a member of said Home, he declares
 and states the facts to be that he is now 58 years old; that he is 5 feet and 10 inches high; that
 he is of Light complexion, Gray eyes, and Gray hair; that he was born in the town of
Waynesville in the County of Dewitt, Ills., on the 10 day
 of April, 1844; that he has been (²) once enrolled in the U. S. A. service; in the war
 against _____, and _____ in the war of the late Rebellion; and that he has been (³) once honorably dis-
 charged from the service of the United States. That the following is a true statement of the time and place of his enrollment, and
 and discharge from said service, and of the cause of his discharge, and of his rank at the respective date thereof namely:

That he now receives, on pension certificate number 430215, a pension of Ten dollars a month,
 payable the 4th day of next April, at the Chicago Pension Office.

That he owns property, real and personal, of the value of Nothing dollars, and no more; that he has no
 means of self-support other than the above named; that his trade or occupation is that of a Day Laborer.

That he has (⁴) a wife; that he has 2 children now living; ages, respectively, 30- to 33
 years. That his postoffice address is Waynesville, State of Illinois, that his nearest railway station is
Waynesville, on the Van Railway, in Dewitt County in said
 State; that the name and address of the person, to whom he desires notice of his illness or death shall be given, is

Hattie Stanipples, of Waynesville, County of Dewitt, State of
Illinois; that, in case of his death, he desires all his personal effects to be sent to Hattie
Stanipples, at Waynesville, County of Dewitt, State of Ills.

That he has not heretofore been a member of any Soldiers', Sailors', or other Charitable Home or Institution, excepting the
 (⁵) was not here in any Home was any place

That he is now a bona fide resident of the State of Illinois, and has continuously lived and resided in said State for the last
 two years, or has served in an Illinois organization.

That he is so far disabled by (⁶) Rupture Lung Trouble
and some Heart trouble
and is not able to earn his support
 as to now be incapable of earning his own living.

That he has at all times, heretofore, supported and adhered to the government of the United States of America, and that he
 has not at any time been engaged in, or countenanced, or aided, or abetted, the cause of the late Rebellion.

That if he shall be admitted to be a member of the said Home, he will, in all things and in every respect, comply with and
 conform to the rules and regulations made, or that shall hereafter be made, for the government and discipline of the same; and
 that he will cheerfully do and perform any and all things that shall be required of him by those there in authority over him; and
 that he will promptly, and willingly, obey all lawful orders that he shall receive from any officer of the Home, so long as he shall
 remain a member thereof.
